

## **Ysgoloriaethau / Scholarships**

**Cymdeithas Madog's Cwrs Cymraeg 2019, Cwrs Tref y Gwartheg – The Cowtown Welsh Course** - will be held July 14-21, 2017 at Southern Alberta Institute of Technology (SAIT) Calgary, Alberta, Canada.

Thanks to the generosity of Welsh-American organizations such as the **National Welsh American Foundation** and private donations, *Cymdeithas Madog* is able to award scholarships to help students study Welsh.

### **Q: What scholarships are available for 2019?**

**A:** (1) The Naomi Mergenthal Memorial Scholarship is awarded to a promising student of the Welsh language who is 22 years of age or younger. The scholarship covers full tuition and shared room and board. Travel costs and optional extra expenses are not covered. Students who have not previously received the Mergenthal scholarship may apply.

(2) The Barckley Scholarship is awarded to the applicant with the most compelling reasons for both attending the *Cwrs* and needing financial aid. The recipient is chosen from the general pool of scholarship applicants and receives a partial scholarship.

(3) *Cymdeithas Madog* also awards several additional partial scholarships annually,

depending on the number of applicants and the available funds.

### **Q: Do you have a matching scholarship program?**

**A:** Yes. *Cymdeithas Madog* participates in a matching scholarship program with many local Welsh societies and other organizations. We will match the scholarship contribution of a Welsh group, an educational institution, or other non-profit organization up to a determined amount. Contact your local Welsh society, school, or organization to see if it is willing to cooperate with *Cymdeithas Madog* to fund a scholarship.

### **Q: How do I apply for a scholarship?**

**A:** The scholarship application for 2019 will be available in February on the *Cymdeithas Madog* website at [www.madog.org](http://www.madog.org). Or, an application may be requested from the Scholarship Coordinator by mail or e-mail.

### **Q: What is the closing date for submitting a scholarship application?**

**A:** It should be postmarked by **March 31, 2019**.

### **Q: Does submission of a scholarship application reserve a place for me on the course?**

**A:** No. You also need to register for the course and send in your \$100 (US) deposit to the *Cwrs Cymraeg* Registrar.

### **Q: Is my deposit refundable if I am not awarded a scholarship?**

**A:** Yes. If you are not awarded a scholarship and

cannot afford to attend otherwise, you may request a full refund of your deposit within 30 days after the offer is made. **Please notify the scholarship coordinator of your decision to accept or not accept a scholarship offer within 2 weeks of the offer.** If for any reason you cannot come to the course after accepting an offer, please notify the scholarship chair immediately. Your deposit will not be refunded after you accept a scholarship.

### **Q: Do I need a letter of recommendation?**

**A:** Yes. A person who knows of your interest in the Welsh language must write a letter of recommendation on your behalf and send it directly to the Scholarship Committee, postmarked by **March 31, 2019**. Please send letters to:

Letters of recommendation have come from teachers, clergy, and fellow members of local Welsh societies.

If you are applying for a matching scholarship, your sponsoring organization must send a letter directly to the Scholarship Committee, confirming the amount of money to be pledged for you.

### **Q: How does *Cymdeithas Madog* fund its scholarships?**

**A:** Funding for the *Cymdeithas Madog* Scholarship Program comes from various sources, including grants provided by the National Welsh American Foundation, contributions by local Welsh societies and private donors, and from *Cymdeithas Madog* itself. *Cymdeithas Madog* has established a Scholarship Endowment Fund to increase its ability to award scholarships.

**Q: How can I make a contribution to the Cymdeithas Madog Scholarship Fund?**

**A:** Many students request assistance with the tuition to attend Cwrs Cymraeg. Your donation can help another student explore the Welsh language.
